INTRODUCTION.

THE plan of the following exercise is very simple. Each prophetic passage is to be read by a single voice, and the corresponding passage in the fulfillment is to be read in chorus by the school.

The superintendent, or a selected reader, may read all the prophetic passages, or one may be selected to read all the passages from each prophet. If each prophet is to be represented by a separate reader, there will be required enough for the following: Moses, Malachi, Isaiah, David and Zechariah.

The aim of the exercise is to bring vividly before the mind the clearness and minuteness of prophecies concerning the Messiah.



THE PROPHETS.

Moses.—

I will raise them up a Prophet from among their brethren, like unto thee, and will put my words in his mouth; and he shall speak unto them all that I shall command him.

And it shall come to pass, that whosoever will not hearken unto my name, I will require it of him.

But the prophet, which shall presume to speak a word in my name, which I have not commanded him to speak, or that shall speak in the name of other gods, even that prophet shall die.

And if thou say in thine heart, How shall we know the word which the Lord hath not spoken?

When a prophet speaketh in the name of the LORD, if the thing follow not, nor come to pass, that is the thing which the LORD hath not spoken, but the prophet hath spoken it presumptuously: thou shalt not be afraid of him (Deut. xviii. 18-22).

MINISTRY.

Isaiah.—

And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD (Isa. xii. 2).

BETRAYAL, TRIAL AND CRUCIFIXION.

David.—

Yea, mine own familiar friend, in whom I trusted, which did eat of my bread, hath lifted up his heel against me (Psa. xli. 9).

He then lying on Jesus' breast, saith unto him, Lord, who is it?

Jesus answered, He it is, to whom I shall give a sop, when I have dipped it. And when he had dipped the sop, he gave it to Judas Iscariot, the son of Simon (John xiii. 23-26).

He trusted on the LORD that he would deliver him: let him deliver him, seeing he delighted in him (Psa. xxii. 7, 8).

School.—

And they that passed by, reviled him, wagging their heads,

And saying, Thou that destroyest the temple, and buildest it in three days, save thyself. If thou be the Son of God, come down from the cross.

Likewise also the chief priests mocking him, with the scribes and elders, said,

He saved others; himself he can not save. If he be the King of Israel, let him now come down from the cross, and we will believe him (Matt. xxvii. 39-42).

My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me? why art thou so far from helping me, and from the words of my roaring (Psa. xxii. 1)?

And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eloij, lama sabachthani? which is, being interpreted, My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me (Mark xv. 34).




