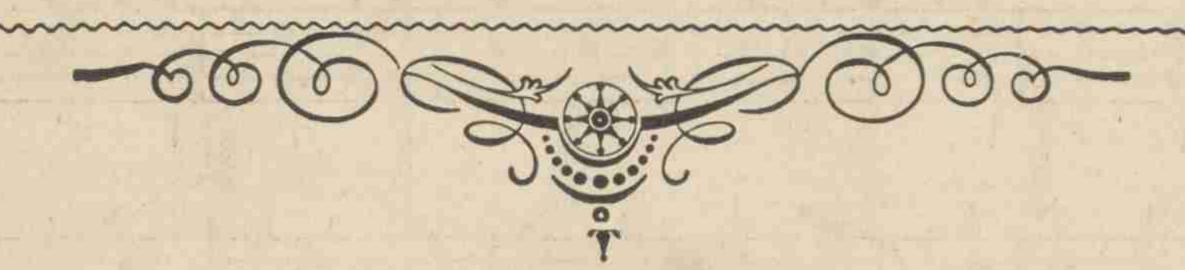

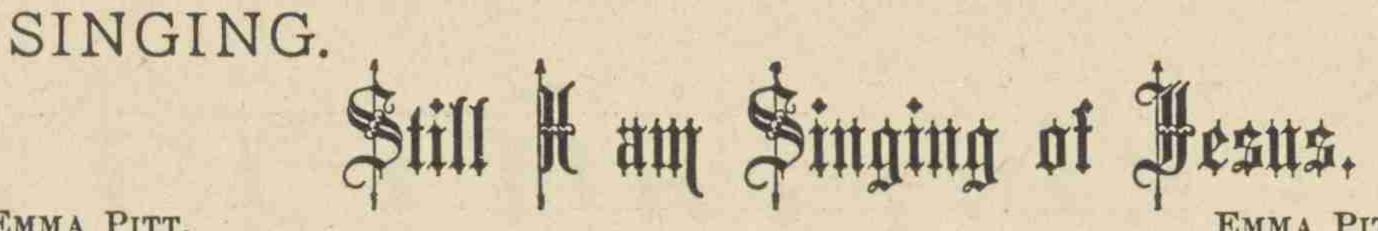
### SCRIPTURE READING. (BY THE PASTOR.)

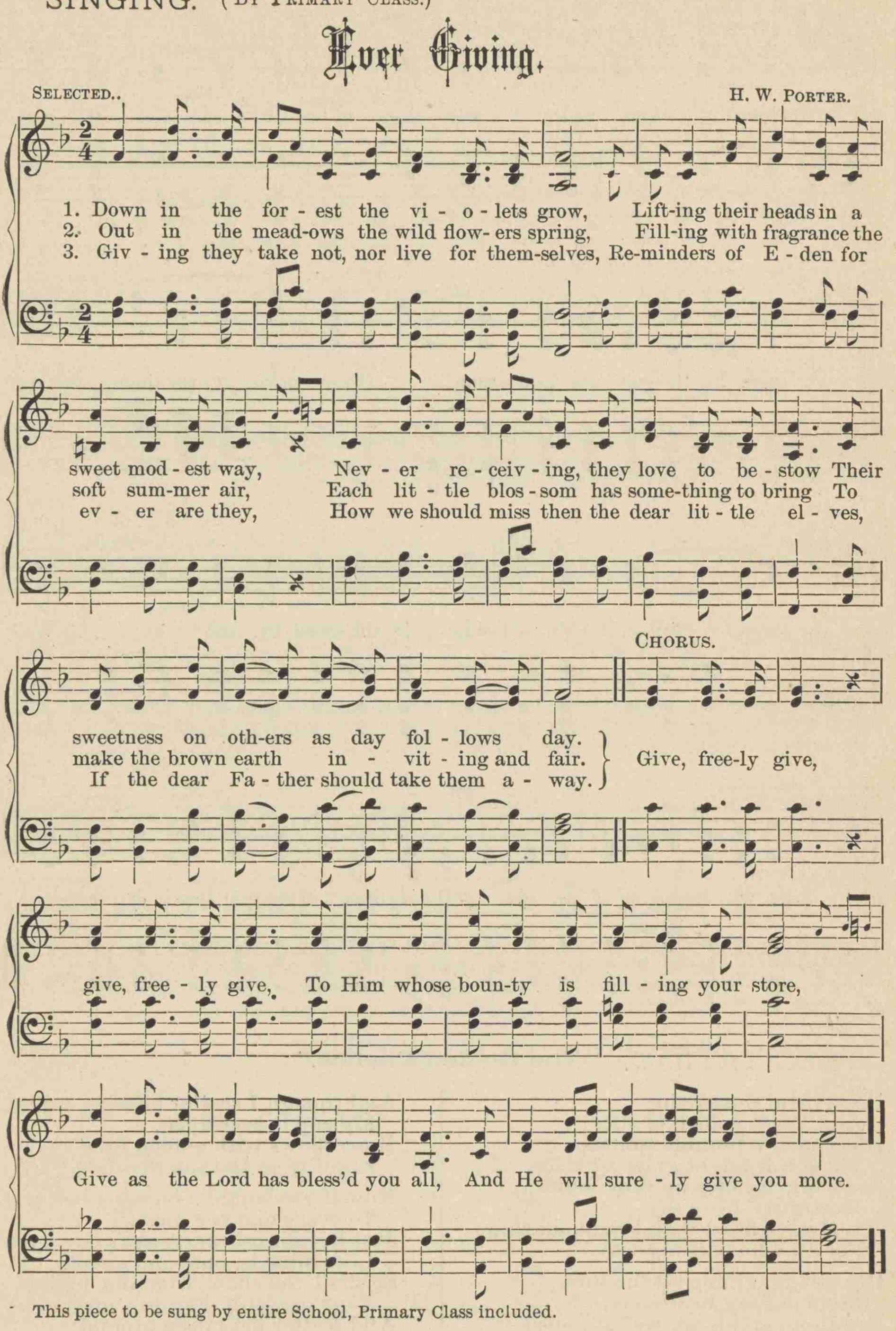
I'm a little Buttercup,

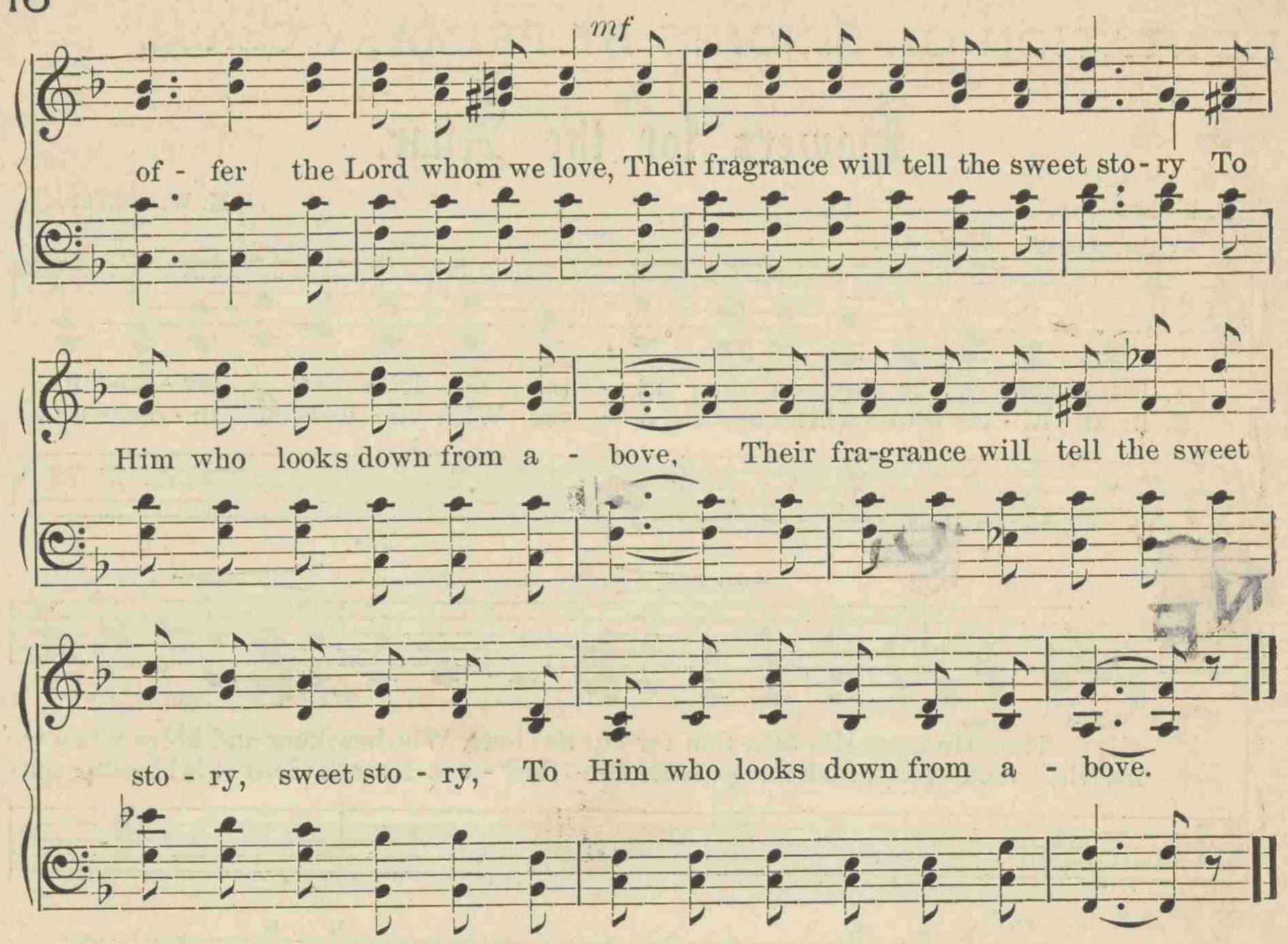
