Fresh from new triumphs in London and in England, J. ROSAMOND JOHNSON and TAYLOR GORDON, return to the United States for another heavily-booked season to sing in New York and the principal music-centres throughout the country. To their New York successes (25 concerts in two years—18 in one season) they have added a series of enormously successful London appearances (10 in London—several in Manchester and various other cities in Great Britain), showing once again the universal appeal of their programs of Negro Spirituals.

In New York last season they gave six public recitals, eleven private musicales, they appeared at the Hotel Plaza and at concerts in honor of royalty, they made a coast to coast tour, three Boston, two Chicago recitals and important engagements at the Brooklyn Academy of Arts and Sciences, Columbia University, Detroit, Denver, Nashville, Los Angeles, San Francisco and throughout the country.
