This very successful book is characterized by all the enthusiasm and freshness of the "first book" of two experienced teachers. The singing school department is compact and clear. More than one hundred pages are devoted to bright new songs, duets, quartettes, etc. Then comes a lot of congregational tunes; and the department of anthems is the most complete of all similar books. The book is, as its title claims, a "Harvest of Song," and a rich, ripe one.

# OPERAS AND CANTATAS.

The Landing of the Pilgrim Fathers. A Cantata, composed for Alto Solo, Chorus and Orchestra. By Otto Singer. 100

the most beautiful work ever produced by an American composer. The historic incidents are accurately preserved; the lights and shades are skillfully blended, and the contrasts so admirably worked up, that the interest of an audience cannot for a moment lag.

Admiral's Daughter. Operetta in three Acts, introducing, in addition to the original music, selections from eight favorite Operas. Written and adapted by H. J. Wetherell. 250

This sprightly Operetta requires but four characters two male and two female—and occupies about two hours in performance. The libretto is full of wit and repartee, interjected so as to hold the interest while it introduces the beautiful and appropriate music. The pages are full sheet music size.

While quite easy of performance, this interesting work is one of its author's most effective productions. The idea—a very happy one—is a competition of different nations, musically, but all uniting at last under the "stars and stripes" in a grand finale, founded on the well-known melodies, sung in an intermingled way, and surrounded by a climax growing out of the previous theme of the Cantata. In all, the Cantata has thirty numbers, (including such melodies as "Old Folks at Home," "Song for Tyrol-land," and patriotic tunes) and will take from one hour to one and a half in performance. It may be given either with or without stage effect and costumes.

This attractive work presents a most powerful argument in favor of temperance. The scene is laid in Jerusalem, 588 years before Christ. The incidents are derived from the Bible, and the music is replete with effective and beautiful melodies. Full directions for costuming accompany the volume.

## TEMPERANCE AND REFORM.

The Crystal Rill. A new collection of Songs, Quartets, Semi-choruses and Choruses, adapted to the wants of Temperance Meetings of all kinds. By W. M. Treloar.

# ORATORIO AND CHORUS MUSIC.

This specimen of Gluck's powerful school of German Music was performed at the Cincinnati May Festival, in 1878. It was written in 1766, and was first brought out in Vienna three years later. The English translation in this the only American Edition is admirable, and the work has been carefully edited by Theodore Thomas.

This powerful work has been pronounced a masterpiece worthy the best of the old masters. It was given under the composer's direction, at the Cincinnati Festival of 1878. For the dedication of new Musical Halls, and similar occasions, it stands without a parallel in power and original grandeur.

This is a convenient copy of one of the great Wagner's most powerful choruses. For festivals it has uncommon attractions, as such events, without a number from the great German master, are "like 'Hamlet,' with Hamlet left out."

Missa Solennis. Composed for the one thousandth anniversary of the Cathedral of Gran, in Hungary. By FRANZ LISZT.

This book contains the vocal score of the following works suitable for festival occasions. (The piano parts are also published in sheet form.) I. "Becalmed at Sea, and Prosperous Voyage."—Rubinstein. II. "The Charm of Edenhall."—Schumann. III. "Easter Morning."—Hiller. IV. "God, Fatherland, Love."—Tschirch. V. "Take Wing, My Song." VI. "German Warrior's Oath and Prayer.'—Mohring. All of these pieces have both German and English words—the English translations by H. A. RATTERMANN. Each piece is also issued separately in the "Standard Chorus" series, which see.

A very effective work, not too long or difficult for societies making the least pretentions to musical proficiency. It is striking and original.

This edition of Rubinstein's masterly work is published, not as the composer wrote it, but with many cuts which, for rep esentation in Oratorio form, and to bring the work within the compass of festival programmes, seems extremely judicious. There can be no question as to the noble qualities of the music. The English translation is skillful and sympathetic. Piano score.

What is said above concerning "Paradise Lost" may be applied to this art-work also. It has been "cut," but notwithstanding presents a continuous, well-connected work for societies and festival occasions. "The Crusaders" is a work of great dramatic coloring and picturesque instrumentation. This edition contains both English and German text.
