PUBLISHERS' PREFACE.

HIS book is issued in response to a call for good, easy male quartets and choruses for young men of ordinary compass of voice.

The book is somewhat of an experiment, as it confines itself to a smaller compass than is usual to male voice collections. We would be pleased to hear from those who use it, after they have given it a fair trial. If it is a success we will follow it with another. And by hearing from various leaders as to which of the songs are liked best, and how many of them are used, and other hints which the experience of leaders may suggest, we will be able to make the second volume better than this one.

We have left the manner of singing—the tempo and expression in most cases—to the taste and judgment of the leader. The keys also in which the songs are sung may be varied; especially may they be pitched a half-step or a step higher than we have printed them in some instances where the first tenor singer has the easy compass. In those songs where one part has a solo, also where the melody is in the second tenor, the other parts should restrain and subordinate themselves.
